3.1 Brian Iles, County Councillor

Brian reported that NCC is currently working well and better than it had been. Highways is still the best performing department, dealing quickly and efficiently with issues as they arise. Flooding is one of their biggest issues at the moment – let them know of any flooding issues in Halvergate / Tunstall. County Farms currently have 17,500 acres, 16,000 of which will always be guaranteed. Therefore there is a leeway of 1,500 for selling and development. In 2019, sold barns and land that amounted to £6.5m which has helped to finance the County. The Law department at NCC is very slow at the moment and difficult to find out what is going on. Brian announced that he will not be standing at the next election and that Lana Hempsall will stand in his place.

3.2 Grant Nurden, District Councillor

Grant introduced Lana Hempsall, as the Broadland Cabinet Portfolio Holder for Planning. He has a 2021 £500 grant for equipment to be awarded to any group meeting the criteria for receiving it. From this year's grant, there is still £90 to spend. Any unspent grants are put into the Start-up Grant Scheme. Broadland DC has started its Community at Heart Lottery (full details on BDC's website). There is also support for Broadland businesses that have been affected by Covid, with the Business Support Grant (full details on BDC's Website). BDC have been preparing the Budget for next year and how they can continue to deliver a quality service to Broadland residents post Covid. The Internal Drainage Board should be reporting on its activities within the Halvergate Marshes and sending a copy to the Parish Clerk. Grant has new contact details which can be found on the BDC website. Clerk to amend details on Parish Website too.

3.3 Lana Hempsall

Lana explained that if there are projects in the Community that need funding, the Community at Heart Lottery is a good idea. When asked by a Councillor about whether Acle's infrastructure could cope with the new houses being built, Lana said that it could. Both Acle Primary and Acle Academy have the capacity for more pupils, although the Academy needs significant investment in its facilities. The Doctors Surgery is privately run and has the funding and space to absorb further expansion. A link road will be put in from the mini roundabout across to the South Walsham Road, as part of the work done on the dualling of the A47 and the next allocation of homes, which should mean less traffic will go through Acle.

8.1 Budget 2021/22

The draft Budget for the Parish Council for 2021/22 was approved by all Councillors

8.2 Precept 2021/22

Councillors voted to increase the Parish Precept by 1% - an overall increase of approximately £89.29 to £9,018 which would mean an increase of 41p for Band D households (based on a Tax Base of 218).

8.3 Village Hall Roof

Councillors discussed the two quotes received (Beighton Builders and LJ Brickley Roofing) and decided to accept the one from Beighton Builders to strip 2 rows of slates above and below the lead and replace the felt, at £750.00, excl VAT. It was accepted that there could be extra costs if woodwork repairs were necessary.

8.4 Churchyard Grass Cutting Quote

Councillors agreed to accept the quote from Mr Debbage for cutting the grass in Tunstall and Halvergate Churchyards for 2021 - £1,750 which is unchanged from 2020.
